Courage and Self Sacrifice

I was tremendously inspired by a documentary I saw about the end of World War II

In early 1945 the Soviet army was descending upon Berlin. Many in the German army had had enough, and decided to flee by swimming the dangerous Elbe River to escape the Red Army. Capture by the Red Army meant a forced marched to Siberia with a 1 in 10 chance of surviving, and then as a mere shell of your former self, it would be 11 years before you saw home again.

Hitler's cronies were risking drowning in the Elbe to get to the Americans on the other side. But one unit of the regular German Army, safe on the western side of the river, heard about some of their mates who were trapped and surrounded in a forest with no hope of breaking out. I was amazed at how a large number of those German soldiers volunteered to recross the river to try and save their comrades. They sacrificed the prospect of getting back home, in favour of incredible courage and self sacrifice to save others.

It reminded me of another very important event in history. I couldn't help thinking of a verse in the Bible where Jesus says, "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." (John 15:13). This could easily be said of many in the Australian Defence Force since 1915. It really is the highest expression of selflessness and courage.

But the most amazing example of self sacrifice and courage is seen in God Himself.

When we consider He is the one who created all things, we become even more amazed. The information in a microscopic DNA molecule is incredibly extensive, and the distances in the universe have been calibrated by modern astronomy to be vaster than anything we could have imagined before.

The one great Creator of all this became flesh and blood and lived amongst us. But if that isn't staggering enough. He allowed Himself to be brutally punished and killed so that every one of us would have the opportunity to spend the rest of eternity in Heaven with Jesus, once our lives here are over. The good news is that we do not have to do good works to be able to accept this offer of the saving of our souls. If we believe in our hearts that Jesus Christ is the one and only true Messiah, the Living God, but in flesh and blood, and our personal Saviour and Lord, then it is well with our souls in all eternity.

But "to believe" means, as Jesus says, to deny ones self and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will save it. (Luke 9:23-24)

Taking up our cross means we are willing to give back to our Creator, our very being, even if one day it may mean laying down our life to remain faithful to Jesus. But beyond this life is eternal life, forever enjoying fellowship with God like we were meant to from the beginning.

Jesus courage saw Him go to the cross willingly, and certainly not by accident, because He knew He had to take the penalty for ours and this entire world's evil to enable us to have gracious forgiveness as a free gift. In other words, we had to pay a great debt, but Jesus paid it for us, with His willingness to submit to a cruel death, even though He is all powerful.

Jesus sacrifice saw him suffer on the cross so that we never needed to suffer for our sins ourselves.

If you are willing to receive it, ask God into your life, knowing that His courage and self-sacrifice have brought you the gift of eternal life.

Exercise Talisman Saber 2017

I am also keen to attend the "Talisman Saber 2017" exercise up north (along with Senior Rep Richard Gibson). I had heard about this exercise a couple of years ago, & had made sure it was in the diary if there were to be an opportunity of attending. The enormity of the exercise in my mind has to be seen to believed – my mind boggles at the logistics that must go into an exercise of this size. Talisman Saber is now in its 7th year, held bi-annually between the Australian & US Military.

Exercise Talisman Saber (also spelled Talisman Sabre, the spelling alternating between US and Australia) is a biennial joint Australia-United States military exercise. Talisman Saber involves joint exercises performed by the Australian Defence Force and the United States Military across six locations in northern and central Australia, the Coral Sea, and in Honolulu, Denver, and Suffolk, Va., though the bulk of the exercises are concentrated at the Shoalwater Bay Military Training Area and other locations in northern and central Australia and Australia's territorial sea and exclusive economic zone. To reflect its bilateral nature, leadership of the exercise switches between Australia and the US every 2 years; primary leadership is reflected in the varied spelling of Saber/Sabre. The exercise focuses on crisis-action planning and contingency response, enhancing both nations' military capabilities to deal

Talisman Sabre 2015 was conducted over 20 days from early to mid-July 2015 and involved up to 30,000 US and Australian troops. It was the largest combined military exercise undertaken by the Australian Defence Force (ADF). Defence forces from New Zealand (500 personnel) and Japan (40 personnel) also took part. My association with Everyman's began soon after I was posted to Kapooka as a Corporal, in 1983. My wife to be, Bronwyn, and I volunteered to open the Everyman's Centre in the evenings to give the full time Rep a break. After 3 years, we were posted to Brisbane, where we kept in touch with Stacey Kruck, who was CCOM at the time. It wasn't until I posted back to Bandiana in 1993 and then Kapooka, just before my discharge that I had the opportunity once again, to volunteer with Everyman's.

I discharged from the army in 1995, after 21 years of service. Since then I have been working for myself as a courier. In September 2015 I reached the lowest point in my life: my work was getting me down and my faith was being tested, when I cried to the Lord to show me what He wanted me to do in the future. The Lord answered me in a big way a few Sundays later, when I was prompted to attend a different church in Wagga, only to find Everyman's CCOM Ken Matthews there to preach! He asked if I would be interested in coming back into Everyman's (and later explained he had been praying for new Reps for Kapooka)! By the end of the service, I was in no doubt that God was calling me into this ministry.

I began with the team at Kapooka in July last year as an approved unaccredited Rep; and became fully accredited in December. A lot has changed in the last 21 years, but the Army still runs as I had remembered it. I found I had to hit the ground running with one Rep on extended leave, a second Rep on compassionate leave and the third in hospital with pneumonia! Fortunately the Lord's grace provided. When the Lord puts you into ministry, he puts you in the perfect place where your skills can be used. My spiritual gift has always been service, so I can't think of any better place for me to be to glorify His mighty name than Everyman's - it fits like a glove. My time so far has been the most enjoyable time in my life for such a long time. I love to spread a bit of Army knowledge (Waries) and at times the Gospel to the Recruits; but mostly I love just serving them their 'brew and biscuit' making sure that all the praise goes to our Lord.



Last year we began the upgrade of the Recreation Centre at Latchford. The lounge has been completed providing a small sitting area with a TV and all the snacks, drinks and frozen food a soldier could want! It's nice to have the rec rooms but we need to have Reps in them in the evenings to connect on a personal level with the soldiers of our ADF.
