Jeff came to Everyman's in such an amazing way that he felt compelled to share that journey with you... "I have had a burden on my heart for ages to reach out and help men in all walks of life, so a few years back I initiated a men's group at our church called "MEN'S MESS".

The idea of Men's Mess was based on the concept of an "Army Mess", where personnel would meet, come together for food, fellowship and support (natural and spiritual). Interestingly, this was ages before I had heard the name "EVERYMAN'S WELFARE SERVICE".

A short time after starting Men's Mess for the church, my Pastor informed me that a rep from Everyman's, Phil Marshall, had contacted him regarding a speaking engagement at our church; however this meeting did not eventuate.

Six months later the proprietor of a coffee shop at Ferny Grove, the suburb where I reside, handed me an Everyman's card with Phil Marshall's name on it. He also said to me that I should contact Phil.

I thought at the time that it was interesting that someone else outside the church environment should mention Everyman's and Phil to me.

I remember praying and asking God what his will was, and for him to show me without any doubt if he wanted me to be involved in Everyman's. After lifting up the matter to the Lord, I abandoned the prayer solely, and left it in the hands of my Heavenly Father. At the same time I made a conscious decision not to do anything in the natural until somehow the Lord confirmed his will.

I do recall thinking at the time that it would be almost impossible for God to show me in a real powerful way if I should be a part of Everyman's, especially without me instigating any actions on my part, but I was wrong!

A number of months had passed again, during which time I had almost forgotten about the prayer request, then one day at my workplace at Brisbane Airport an interesting meeting took place.

I recall walking past a gentleman in the foyer who was introduced to me as "Phil Marshall", and then I was handed his card. On seeing the name I thought to myself that it sounded familiar!

Then as I walked outside my work building I nearly fell over; there parked in the building carpark was a van with "EVERYMAN'S WELFARE SERVICE" written on it.

Mind you, this happened at a location about 30 kilometres away from my church, home and the coffee shop at Ferny Grove!

I believe that God had placed Phil and Everyman's right under my nose, answering and confirming my prayer about being part of this organisation in a real and tangible way.

I contacted Phil; and after chatting with him about Everyman's I realised this was where the Lord wanted me to be, so I signed up!

I still work full time for the Government, but am happy to be part of Everyman's, on weekends, days off and in anyway needed. I am currently attached to Canungra Army Base - B13C & B13D - KOKODA BARRACKS."

Lyndley spearheaded

the request, with Ken in full agreement and we were delighted when the CDF gave his approval for the deployment of philanthropics to re-commence after many years of absence. He wanted a Sallyman or Everyman in place by Christmas, just a few short months away!

Ken requested Lyndley be the first to deploy, as he had worked hard to make it happen; and so he paved the way for subsequent Everyman's and Sallyman REPs to have the honour of serving not only our ADF, but our allies as well. From the Chief Commissioner Ken Matthews



The first half of 2017 is passing rapidly and Everyman's rejoices in the privilege of being able to continue doing what we have done for the past 77 years. Recently I was called to address a Lions Club dinner celebrating volunteers and the need every community has for them. I shared with them the story of Everyman Len Buck's service to Commonwealth troops on the Malay Peninsula in 1942. It is Everyman's real life war story written by American military historian, Professor Robert Linder. Adding to what I already knew, Prof Linder's exposition shed light on a volunteer who literally risked his life every day.

I shared with the group how I truly appreciated the many volunteers who risk life and limb and how Len was an example of that. Len didn't have to go to the front. He was a businessman who was greatly needed at home during the war years, to potentially make lots of money as a tailor supplying uniforms. But heeding the call of God and country, he chose to ask Defence at the time if he could go to the front and take Everyman's first Brew Truck. So to RAF Command Far East in Malaya he went.

Doing his Brew Runs, Len risked capture all the way along the peninsula during the retreat. He risked being bombed to death as he remained in Singapore, staying back as long as he could to minister to the Defence members there. Finally ordered out of Singapore, he risked being drowned by the enemy on the very last ship to leave. Out of 16 ships trying to get out, only 2 made it, the rest being sunk by Japanese aircraft. Even out in the open sea, the Japanese air attacks continued and Len determined to stay up on deck instead of sheltering inside. In this way he could minister to the wounded, but had to find shelter behind the ship's funnel during the frequent attacks. In the lulls, Len went to comfort and pray with the injured and dying. Len could have been badly injured in one attack by shrapnel but a book in his breast pocket took the brunt of it. The book was the Christian tract, "The Reason Why" which Len had shared with many during his Malaya experience and which imparted hope and reassurance in these desperate times.

I have no doubt that the men and women of Everyman's today would do the same. They love the people of the Defence Force irrespective of their race, religion or background. They do it for the same reason, because they have a message of hope and redemption to share. ACOMM George Thomas is currently deployed in the Middle East. George has always shared the same commitment and love that Len demonstrated in World War 2.

Please continue to support Everyman's, as we work to upgrade our entire fleet of Brew Trucks. This is just one of many challenges we have. You can be a part of the mission Len Buck started, by supporting Everyman's. You have opportunity now to be part of a lasting and on-going blessing to our veterans and serving members.

Fleet Project 17

What a time it has been as we have been blessed with new additions to our Brew Truck fleet as we seek to upgrade and replace the old vehicles that have served the ADF well over many years. Nevertheless our Brew Truck upgrade and replacement programme remains a huge ongoing challenge for a small not for profit organisation like Everyman's. It has only been through your generosity in contributing to new trucks, that our Brew Runs to the ADF are an on-going reality.

The Toyota Landcruiser is our preferred vehicle: tried, proven and excelling in the difficult terrain used by the ADF for military exercises. Recently a Commanding Officer (CO) requested a second Everyman's vehicle to meet the growing demand for our service. We were able to oblige with an ageing vehicle that is not fully decked out. Nonetheless the gesture was appreciated by the CO and both vehicles on that base are being fully utilised.

The price tag of the Landcruiser continues to rise; and we continue the ongoing project of replacing our ageing fleet. To this end we invite you to consider making a donation to Fleet Project 17.

The ADF will continue to be called upon, in the future, to support Australia's on-going domestic and overseas operations, as will our welfare service to them. To be enabled to do so, they will have a rigorous training regime in tough and remote training areas around the country. This is where they love to find the Everyman's Brew truck, at the end of a long, hot, punishing patrol. Here the Everyman's and Everywoman's REPs are on hand not only for the hot or cold brew, but also for a quiet chat and that personal discussion when needed.

ADF personnel have testified as to how "the Everyman was a life saver" behind the Brew Truck over a cordial or a cuppa. Today we invite you to partner with us, in this welfare outreach. Please consider supporting Fleet Project 17 to purchase a vehicle required to traverse many kilometres and negotiate a lot of off road driving in military training areas and the Australian outback. Last year, Everyman's was part of a major Exercise in Cultana, South Australia, travelling in convoy with the ADF vehicles, from South East Queensland to South Australia, only to deal with roads that had become a muddy quagmire in the cold and wet wintery conditions.
