"Better than a Hallelujah"

We are usually excited about the looming end of year break. It is a time of re-connecting with family and friends. But we can often forget that Christmas is emotionally debilitating for many. The reality may be that some of us feel we are that person who is going through a personal pain that we don't really think we can share with anyone. We will attend parties over the holidays, and put on a party face when deep down we are distraught and haunted with sorrow. Even keeping up the festive façade can be traumatic.

That little baby at Bethlehem, as amazing as it seems, is our God and King; a great and loving God who came into the world to end all that breaks our hearts; and to destroy once and for all, the evil that oppresses us. If you have some personal pain you are dealing with, be assured you are never the only one who knows about it. Someone else knows more about your problems than you ever will. The baby of Bethlehem says to us today, Come to me all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light. (Matthew 11:28-30). Does "rest for your soul" sound like what you need today? You may well say; "What am I supposed to say when I don't even know how to put my problem in words to Him?

There is a beautiful verse in Romans 8:26 that says "the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness. For example, we don't know what God wants us to pray for. But the Holy Spirit prays for us with groanings that cannot be expressed in words."

Indeed it is a great mystery; the one God is in the form of 3 persons, one of which is the Holy Spirit. So God the Holy Spirit actually prays for us. We just have to open our hearts to be willing to talk with God who hears all our cries and feels our pain. We know He will answer the honest prayer, even if the answer is not what we originally wanted. But the outcome will be everything the infinitely wise God knew we needed in the first place.

The clumsiest prayer from our heart is more precious to God than anything we have that we could ever offer Him.

Amy Grant has a beautiful song called "Better than a Hallelujah" which says in part:

The tears of shame for what's been done
The silence when the words won't come
Are better than a Hallelujah sometimes
We pour out our miseries
God just hears a melody
Beautiful the mess we are
The honest cries of breaking hearts
Are better than a Hallelujah

Will you take your cares to Jesus Christ who was once that little babe of Bethlehem and will one day be the coming King whose rule will never end? He will lead you to one or more of his faithful servants who will pray for you, and help you to see that no matter what the problem is, our great God and Savour in Jesus can heal and restore you to be wiser and stronger than you ever were before.

From the Chief Commissioner Ken Matthews

What a great year we have had thus far; to be at the big Exercise Hamel at Cultana in South Australia, blessed by a new invitation to serve the RAAF recruits, staff, and trainees at Forrest Hill, and a renewed presence on overseas operations in the Middle East. Senior REP Richard GIBSON was able to encourage many a young soldier at Ex Hamel, particularly in the early part where the rain and cold make the training area look just like the Western Front. A hot tea or coffee (brew) was very welcome!



REP Ben RIDLEY, attached to 8/9 Battalion Enoggera, was able to deploy overseas for four months, to support our Defence personnel staging in and out of operations in the Middle East Region. Ben's contribution was greatly appreciated. He was indeed an indispensible presence assisting the vital work Chaplains did not always have the resources to cover; and heading out with the Brew Truck to the desert range practices in the evening. It is increasingly important for Everyman's to be in the field and on operations for our ADF personnel. I had the great joy and privilege of being invited once again as a delegate to the national ADF Continuum to Recovery Conference in Canberra. The conference is attended by health professionals, senior ADF commanders, ADF Chaplains, and Everyman's to grapple with the on-going challenge of caring for those who have been wounded in overseas conflicts. Wounds are not only physical and visible, but can and do have effect deep down in the hearts of veterans and serving personnel. The person playing golf, who looks great on the outside, may be emotionally scarred on the inside; scarred to the point of contemplating suicide. It is heart breaking for us in Everyman's to know that this is a reality we now face in the modern Australian Defence Force, which is now frequently called upon for operations in the most violent places on our globe.

This is where Everyman's comes in. Whether it is in the rec centre, or a hot desert in the Middle East, or behind the Brew Truck at Cultana or Wide Bay; Everyman's is often the first point of contact. Everyman's is the first hope an ADF member has in starting to unpack their fears and hurts. It is so easy to stroll up to the Everyman truck to "grab a brew." It is a safe and confidential place where the ADF can start to speak of their concerns. The Everyman is then the one who can say, "Mate why don't we take a walk together to see the Chaplain." In many cases Everyman's has, unbeknown to us, saved lives from the path of suicide. We just have to be with them, whether that is in the field or in the Rec Centre.

However to do this we need good, reliable Brew Trucks, a new mobile rec centre for the field exercises; and more volunteers to become Everyman's REPs to work in Australia and overseas. I am saddened at times when we have opportunities to send REPs overseas, but are unable to do so, due to a lack of REPs who are able to go. We desperately want to share the great hope and peace that our loving God has made available to all who seek Him. ADF personnel are a vital and indispensible part of our community. What can we do - what can you do - to make sure the very real struggles they have, can be met with someone who loves and cares for them? Whether it comes by being an Everyman's REP or by donating from your resources to make new Brew Trucks a reality, your contribution to Everyman's can be a very tangible way of demonstrating your concern and care for our Defence Force through Everyman's. Please take time out to consider how you might be able to respond and contact us to share your thoughts.

Time certainly has not stood still since the last On Patrol with many wonderful opportunities to share the Everyman's story opening up from Victoria to the Northern Territory. It has been exciting to see our new brew truck 'Support Vehicle Northern' (pictured at left)

being rolled out. It is a much needed addition to our fleet and will be deployed mostly within Queensland, but will follow troops around Australia as they take part in training exercises. Richard will enjoy this new rig, while Ben will endure Richard's old brew truck (as we recycle our vehicles).

In 2016 our fleet increased in size to meet the growing demand for Everyman's Reps and Brew Trucks in the field with the ADF and to replace our ageing fleet. Our eyes have now turned to the next one, 'Fleet 17 Project', another Landcruiser, actually another two Landcruisers!

The budget for two new vehicles is \$180K; the price of each vehicle is \$90K, including set-up costs of \$30K. Our vehicles are our major expense, both procurement and maintenance are an ongoing cost. If there is any way you can assist us in purchasing these, I would love to hear from you. Get in touch with me via Everyman's Headquarters (details on the last page).

We are also scrambling to fill positions. It is exciting to have different barracks asking us to establish a presence, but both people and funds are needed to fulfil these tasks. Please keep us in your thoughts and prayers as to how you might help Everyman's provide our ADF personnel the assistance they require. Just a few weeks ago I was in a meeting with a commander who sang the praises of Everyman's people and the service that he had personally experienced. He was eager for us to re-establish ourselves to provide support on his base. It was so encouraging to be able to share with him tales of people like you, who have faithfully supported us over many years; doing all you can to enable us to continue our work amongst the Australian Defence Force. His message to you was, "Tell them a big thank you from me and my staff for all they do. We, the ADF, really appreciate it and them".

So be encouraged, be inspired, be optimistic, be steadfast; do not grow weary in your well-doing... The Australian Defence Force appreciate you, we the volunteers of Everyman's appreciate you, and we are committed to continue doing all we can with what you give, to honour your commitment to us and the ADF personnel with pride, dignity and joy!


