A Trip Down Memory Lane

Recently a man by the name of Gordon FISHER was amazed to see an Everyman's Brew Truck parked outside his neighbour's house sporting Ed BENTLEY'S "Everyman's" logo on its side. Gordon's dad, Jim FISHER, was a big supporter of Everyman's, assisting SNRREP Ed BENTLEY in Ed's Brisbane/Wacol days. Ed was responsible for the logo which is now on all our new Brew Trucks.

Now Gordon was a neighbour of current REP Ben RIDLEY!

Gordon shared some great photo's with Ben, which are very typical of Everyman's in the 1950's and generously allowed Ben to pass them on for all to see and enjoy.



At left is one of the regular Saturday night meetings at the Everyman's Hut at Wacol in 1954.

They usually filmed a Christian based movie for the troops followed by the tasty fresh scones, sandwiches (see on front table) and of course a nice hot brew afterwards.

Jim and his wife are seated in the front row next to the aisle, along with Gordon (the little boy in the front) and his older sister.

These nights sometimes included a singalong, and on Sunday nights a service, presided over by the unit Chaplain. Note Ed's "Everyman's" logo up on the back wall of the hut!

In the mid 1950's photo below, we have SNRREP Ed BENTLEY in his Everyman's uniform along with a lady who we think is Ed's wife, Laurel. The men behind Ed are Jim FISHER (standing on the left) who is part of the male quartet from Corinda Gospel Chapel. Ed most probably got Jim and the Quartet to perform in the Everyman's Hut from time to time, to not only entertain the troops, but to let them hear of the good news of the Gospel in song.

Praise God for faithful servants of days gone by, like Jim, Ed, and Laurel, as well as the many others not named, who prepared the food and fitted out the Everyman's huts for movie nights.

If you ever sat in the Everyman's Hut in those days, to enjoy a movie as a young soldier, or you know some of the folk in these photos, we would love to hear from you.

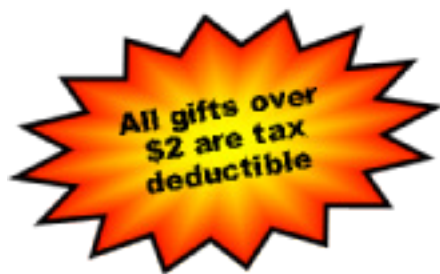
